There are numerous special attractions at Black Expo. Black Expo also places special emphasis on African Americans being a part of the Census Count hosted by My Black Counts to assure that African Americans are included in the process.

This will be echoed by the Sacramento Association of Realtors who will offer first time home buyers sessions both days.

The Black American Political Association of California (BAPAC) will host a two day voters summit with candidates from across the region in local, statewide races participating.

NexGen California is also presenting seminars on the environmental injustice as social justice issue that has disproportionate devastating effects in the Black community.

Sacramento NAACP president Betty Williams will deliver the Status of Black Sacramento in a noon time presentation outlining the current and future opportunities for African Americans.

The Black Expo truly has something for everyone. The event includes Youth World; and the exciting Gospel Sunday filled with singers and choirs.

Of course Black Expo is renowned for shopping for bargains and specialty items in the Marketplace. And the Soul Food Plaza where down home culinary skills will be on display from some of the best restaurants and in Sacramento and surrounding areas is a Black Expo tradition.

Attendees will enjoy a free concert by recording star Adrian Marcel who is also presenting at the Youth Speak as special guest before performing.

With the music, the over 100 exhibitors sharing opportunities that bring mutual benefits, the shopping, the workshop and seminars plus the essence of Black History, this year's Expo is an adventure into culture.
